Staffing Update



On Wednesday 22<sup>nd</sup> May, we will join our Sursum Corda Cluster schools to pray the Glorious Mysteries.


- I. The Resurrection of Jesus.

#### Why is the Rosary so important to our school?

Following the example of our patron, Saint Bernadette, we have a special devotion to Our Lady. In 1858, Our Lady appeared to St. Bernadette 18 times. Bernadette described Mary as 'the beautiful Lady'. When Mary appeared she was seen holding a set of rosary beads in her hands. Each time Mary appeared to St. Bernadette, she would pray the Rosary with Our Lady.

#### The Feast of the Ascension



Ascension Day is one of the great solemnities in our liturgical calendar and honours the bodily ascension of Jesus into heaven. Ascension Day is traditionally celebrated on a Thursday and on the 40th day after Jesus' resurrection on Easter Sunday. This year Ascension Day is celebrated on Thursday 9th May.

'Then He led them out as far as Bethany, and, lifting up His hands, He blessed them. While He was blessing them, He withdrew from them and was carried up into heaven. #### Pentecost — Sunday 19th May

The word Pentecost is Greek and it means "50th day." Fifty days after Easter Sunday, we celebrate the coming of the Holy Spirit upon the Apostles, and the beginning of their Earthly ministry to make disciples of all nations and spread the Good News.

On Pentecost Sunday, when the Holy Spirit descended upon the Apostles, they were granted the gifts of the Holy Spirit. Those gifts helped them to fulfil their mission to preach the Good News to all.

#### Attendance

#### Every minute counts

Frequent absence can add up to a considerable amount of lost learning and can seriously disadvantage your child in adult life.

- $\bullet$  5 minutes late every day means around 3  $\Box$  days of education are missed.
- A score of 90% in a test would be a good result but 90% attendance means that a child will have missed around 100 lessons over a school year.

#### Attendance update

We continue to track attendance every week and work hard to ensure every child in school demonstrates good attendance and punctuality. If children are to reach their full potential, they need to be in school every day, unless they are too unwell to attend. We will make home visits from time to time, particularly if we have safeguarding concerns or if a child's attendance is causing a concern.

Even if a parent has called the school to give a reason for their child's absence, a home visit may still occur. We aim to offer both support and challenge where needed, but always have the child's best interest at heart.



On Monday 22<sup>nd</sup> April 2024 we celebrated World Earth Day! The theme of the day this year was Planet Vs. Plastic. We celebrate this day annually and the children really benefit from the extracurricular activities we provide for them, whilst also learning about how we can protect our planet. During World Earth Day, we also remembered that our actions have an impact on everyone. When we make decisions, we should consider the good of all. We reflected on the Catholic Social Teaching




principles of Stewardship and The Common Good. The Common Good is about respecting the rights and responsibilities of all people and leaving no one behind. Stewardship is all about caring for the many gifts that God has given to us. These include our environment, our own talents and other resources.

#### The FYFS

In Nursery and Reception, they focused on the book called "Here We Are" by Oliver Jeffers. They learned about what makes our world so special. In the nursery, they learned about how to recycle rubbish and made a pledge to help look after our environment. In Reception, they had a variety of activities to complete which shared with them how amazing the world is. They made clay Earths and used shaving foam and glue to create Earth pictures. The children were all sent home with a sunflower seed to plant in their garden!






Year I and 2

Year I played a game with some cards to sort the plastic items that fish could confuse for food. They then explored ways to reduce our plastic waste. Year 2 designed some sea creatures using junk modelling and also created a display which shows how a fish can have plastics found in its stomach as it has eaten

plastic items their environment.



The children in Key Stage 2 took part in an assembly by Sharon Gill from Severn Trent Water. It was a very interactive and engaging show and it helped us to realise just how much water we waste every day! Who would have thought you use more water in a 10-minute shower (90 litres) than in a little bath (80 litres)?



Year 3 took part in a

workshop by Sharon Gill from Severn Trent Water titled "Hydration Heroes." They learned the importance of water in our bodies and that we need to be grateful for the clean water we have in this country to drink and keep us healthy.





Year 4 attended an online meeting with Chester Zoo, where they were taught all about the rainforest. Their learning throughout the day focused on deforestation and the dangers this causes to habitats, creatures, and people. The debate in 4AMJ was really enjoyable, with children pitching against each other on the motion 'Deforestation should be banned'. We had some really good reasons for both sides of the argument, but by the end, the children decided it should be banned, and that land already cleared should be used instead of

clearing new forest. After this busy morning, they created amazing artwork together in teams which depicted the waste and burning in the rainforest.

In year 5 they were treated to a package of work based on plastics led by two University of Birmingham students: Emma and Darryl. They were shown how plastics last forever in our landfill sites. We also held a debate in 5FM with the motion 'Plastic should be banned'. We argued strongly on both sides as some properties of plastics are useful for certain things e.g. hip replacement surgery, but we all summarised the day by explaining how we need to buy fewer things that are made with plastic.



# BeRea

BeReal.

The way children and young people use social media is changing.

They want to engage with posts from their friends instead of 'suggested posts' or adverts for content they don't care about. As social media begins to turn away from filters and 'Instagrammable moments', one app in particular has seen a recent surge in popularity with children and young people

#### What is BeReal?

BeReal is a free social media app that asks users to take a quick snapshot of an 'authentic moment' during their day to share with their followers.

There are no filters or opportunities to stage the 'perfect photo' what you see is what you get. It is formatted to make the user show their 'real self'

This app was developed in France in 2020, but has seen a recent jump in popularity with 3.5 million downloads since January 2022 and a 315% increase in monthly active users.

'Realmojis' are selfie versions of emojis a.k.a. YOU get to be the emoji!





#### low does it work?

BeReal only lets users post once a day. It notifies users of a two-minute 'posting window' via push notification. If they miss the window, they are marked as late.

No profiles, no followers, no likes, no messaging. Users and their 'friends' can only post comments, emojis, and 'realmojis' on the unfiltered posts that day before it is archived.

Focuses on the 'real' you. Users cannot use filters or other photo editing tools and must take a live photo using the app.

A 'discovery' page is used instead of a search page. This is a feed that lets users see others BeReal posts from all around the world.

#### Areas of Concern



Notification dependent so a young person could become easily distracted during inappropriate times of the day (e.g. while in school or during family dinner)



Persuasive design uses negative reinforcement if the app isn't used (limited viewing, labelling late posts) so it persuades users to prioritise it in their day



Perception anxiety means a young person may begin to experience anxiety over what their friends will think of them on the app.



Time constraints like school, jobs, driving, and events mean a young person may not be able to access their phone in order to post.



Possible oversharing could happen in an attempt to be as 'real' as possible and not seem 'fake'

#### Risks



Sense of urgency could mean a young person posts something they wouldn't normally post.



Personal information could be compromised in the 'candid' photos (like location, school, or extracurriculars).



Harmful interactions like bullying, exploitation manipulation, peer abuse, and/or inappropriat behaviour could happen in the comments or with 'realmojis'.



Safety settings are lacking - there are no privacy features, no parental controls, and no blocking abilities on this platform. Just reporting!



The discovery page encourages interaction between complete strangers and could lead to communication on other apps with messaging functions (like Instagram or WhatsApp).

#### Top Tips for Parents and Carers

✓ Discuss responsible sharing - nothing too personal should go online.

Walkthrough image ownership together - their image has worth!

Be an identity reminder - an app does not define the type of person they are.

Talk about authenticity - the difference between 'real' and 'too much information.'

Identify their Trusted Adults - ask who they can trust if they are worried!

Protect their personal information - how can they stay safe online?




