Many thanks in advance for your support with raising money for this important charity.




#### Spanish Lessons

#### Inclement Weather



#### Feast of St Carlo Acutis — 12th October — Class saint ICOT

This month, we celebrate the feast day of St Carlo Acutis on 12th October. Carlo was a remarkable young man from Italy who lived a deep and joyful faith in the modern world. Born in 1991, he is often called the first millennial saint, showing that holiness is possible in every generation.

Carlo had a great love for the Eucharist and used his passion for technology to share his faith, creating a website to catalogue Eucharistic miracles around the world. He believed that the internet could be used as a tool for good and to bring people closer to God.

His canonisation was officially declared on 7 September 2025, when Pope Leo XIV proclaimed him a saint in St. Peter's Square. His life continues to inspire young people and families everywhere to live with faith, kindness, and purpose in their daily lives. As we honour his feast day, may we be encouraged to use our own gifts to serve others and grow in friendship with Christ.

Over the past three weeks, our Year 6 pupils have been taking part in Bikeability. This has been a fantastic opportunity for the children to develop their cycling skills and confidence.


Some children have learned to ride a bike for the very first time, while many others have gained valuable experience riding safely on the road.

It is **very important to apply on time** — late applications are less likely to secure one of your preferred schools.

Applications submitted after 31 October 2025 will be treated as late and will not be processed until after offer day on 2 March 2026.

This month we are celebrating Black History Month. A time where we celebrate and honour the achievements of past and present black inspirational people. A continued engagement with black history is vital as it helps us understand and learn from the past. Black History Month is an opportunity to understand Black histories, going beyond stories of racism and slavery to spotlight Black achievement. Black History Month may only be a month, but we will continue to celebrate the contributions of black culture and individuals in our shared society all year round.

The theme for Black History Month 2025 is "Standing Firm in Power and Pride." It celebrates the strength, courage and achievements of Black communities. It reminds us to welcome others, respect different cultures and be proud of our shared history. By learning about Windrush, we honour the people who made a big difference and make sure their stories are never forgotten. Their journey is part of all of us.

Additionally, this month we will be celebrating the works of Alma Thomas, Vanley Burke, Clementine Hunter, Reggie Laurent, Lois Mailou Jones, Yinka Ilori, Deborah Roberts and Basquiat. The children will then create their own pieces of artwork based on these artists.



## Attendance update

We continue to track attendance every week and work hard to ensure every child in school demonstrates good attendance and punctuality. If children are to reach their full potential they need to be in school every day, unless they are too unwell to attend. We will make home visits from time to time, particularly if we have safeguarding concerns or if a child's attendance is causing a concern. Even if a parent has called the school to give a reason for their child's absence, a home visit may still occur. We aim to offer both support and challenge where needed, but always have the child's best interest at heart.

## Every minute counts

Frequent absence can add up to a considerable amount of lost learning and can seriously disadvantage your child in adult life.

- 5 minutes late every day means around 3 days of education are missed.
- A score of 90% in a test would be a good result but 90% attendance means that a child will have missed around 100 lessons over a school year.
